BLM - Qualifying class for 2010 BLMs. Riders must be members of a participating organization at the time of the show to be eligible
GAIG - Qualifying class for the 2010 GAIG/USDF Championships (*declare qualifying ride on entry form*) – Entry fee plus additional \$10 fee required, **MUST BE PAID PRIOR TO THE START OF THE CLASS.** Rider and owner must be USDF participating members and USEF members; horse must be USDF Lifetime registered and USEF recorded. Owners may be USDF Business Members. Except for FEI Junior or Young Rider Freestyle entries, competitors in freestyle qualifying classes must submit a photocopy of a test verifying eligibility to enter class.
Open - Open to all Horses and Riders. Show management may split into AA's and Junior/Young Rider sections based on class size

AA - Open to Adult Amateurs only; competitors must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22 & they must hold a current USEF Amateur card.

JR/ YR – Open to Juniors and Young riders only; Individuals are eligible as JR until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 18 or YR until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 21 (*specify on entry form*).

TOC - Test of Choice (*specify test level on entry form*). May be qualifier if correct test ridden.

MFS – USDF or FEI Musical Freestyle only; no Pas de Deux or Quadrille.

** Class #223 is a USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal Program Class.

++ Any USEF test not offered in class list above. Excludes DSE, MFS and Young Horse Tests. Please specify test level on entry form.

May ride any FEI test that does not have a specific class. Excludes MFS, Young Horse, Para-Equestrian tests. If ponies are entered and in need of measurement card, an appointment for measuring MUST be made with show management prior to the show. Please specify test level on entry form.

PRIZE LIST DIRECTIVES

General:

- EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- Management reserves the right to split, combine, delete, or add classes dependent on entries. Management also reserves the right to add or substitute judges or make any changes required by circumstances.

Awards:

- Prize (in classes of 3 or more) and up to six ribbons in each class.
- High score awards for the show will be given for each of the following: Training, First, Second, Third, Fourth Levels; Prix St. Georges; Combined FEI levels (I1, I2, and GP); Musical Freestyle. Show High Scores : JR/YR; Adult Amateur, and High Score of Show, excluding MFS, Young Horse. Scores below 55% will not be considered for high score awards.
- Class #223 is a USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal Class
- **Trainers Award.** Trainer plus min. two students. Awarded to team with highest average. Sign-up in office.

NCDCTA Pro-Am Team Challenge

- One Professional plus two - three Amateurs, juniors and/or Young Riders make up a Pro-Am Team. Any level may be ridden; levels may be combined. The 3 highest scores will be averaged to find the Team Score from the Saturday Rides of all Team Members. (Intro, MFS, Young Horse Tests and DSE scores will not be included) Team members (Professionals, Amateurs, Juniors and Young Riders) are considered as a horse/rider combination – if a rider has more than one horse entered in the competition, she may ride on more than one team – each team must have unique horse/rider combinations.
- **Awards:** Trophies for all members of 1st through 6th placing Teams. All Team Members must be present at the Saturday Night Awards Ceremony to receive prizes.
- **Entries:** All team members must be current NCDCTA members. Teams must be named with all team members indicated and all fees paid (\$20/team) by 9am Saturday. Competitors may indicate intention to compete on entry form ('other fee' section) or may sign up in show office. All participants will receive a Team Participation Gift at check-in.
- NCDCTA is sponsoring the Pro-Am Team Challenge as a year-long team competition. Teams and their standings throughout the year will be recognized on the NCDCTA website (www.ncdcta.org). The top scoring teams will receive end of the year prizes. Other prizes may also be awarded. Each team from each show will be considered in the year-long standings. Teams may stick together throughout the year or may re-form from show to show. See www.ncdcta.org for more details.

Levels:

- Current editions of USDF Intro, USEF TRAINING LEVEL through FEI GRAND PRIX and USDF Materiale.

Entries:

- 2010 Entry Forms Required.
- Entries **received** after the closing date will be accepted and placed on a waiting list to be scheduled on a space available basis.
- Entries accepted ONLY with entry form and full payment. Entry form must be signed in ALL THREE signature blocks in accordance with USEF rules, as well as signature in COACH block if applicable. Only original signatures accepted.
- Proof of membership must be included with entry form. Please provide the Master Verification from USEF & USDF (www.eqverification.org) although membership cards or photocopies of cards are still acceptable. Failure to provide proof of USEF and/or USDF membership will result in competitor being charged non-member fees.
- Negative Coggins valid through the last day of the show is required for entry to show grounds for all horses. Entries without a current Coggins WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. A photocopy is acceptable provided the date, results, horse name, and vet signature are legible.
- DO NOT send entries registered, certified mail or Signature required. No telephone, FAX, or email entries.
- Post entries (**received after the closing date**) will be accepted on a space available basis, for a \$20 post entry fee

 - Until closing date, refunds on entries minus \$20 office fee. **NO REFUNDS after closing date, including stabling and overpayments, for any reason including Acts of God, Acts of Terrorism, Inclement weather, and/or other emergencies.**

- Fees must be paid in full with entry form. If full payment is not received or a check for entry fees is returned, the entry will be placed on a waiting list until all fees are paid in cash, money order, or cashier's check. **ALL RETURNED CHECKS ARE SUBJECT TO A \$30 SERVICE FEE.**
- Show office will be open: 4pm—6pm Friday, 7am—6pm Saturday, 7am—1 hour after show ends on Sunday.

Guest Horses/Horse Saddle Fitting:

- Guest Horse: must register with the Show Secretary, provide completed entry form, show proof of current Coggins, and pay \$35 fee. Must also pay grounds/stabling fees and Office Fees but not USEF Fees.
- Horse Saddle Fitting: must register with the Show Secretary, provide completed entry form, show proof of current Coggins, and pay \$50 fee which includes day parking and office fee. Do not pay USEF Fees.

Acknowledgements/Times:

- Acknowledgement of entry showing status will be emailed (or mailed) to each competitor. Please check for errors and notify the secretary immediately. Entry status will also be posted at www.greyhorse1.com.
- Times will be available on the website (www.greyhorse1.com) approximately one week prior to the competition date or by phone from the secretary the Monday prior to the show. **TIMES WILL NOT BE MAILED.**
- Please verify final ride times at check-in.

Freestyle Requirements:

- Riders must present music on good quality cassette tapes or CD's to the Show Secretary at least 2 hours prior to scheduled time for the ride. Riders must submit with their entry a copy of the highest test of the level entered or higher level (with a minimum score of 60%) in accordance with USEF rules.

Stabling:

- Permanent 10x10 stalls, with sliding doors, in central-aisle barns. Includes 2 bags of shavings.
- **NOTE: SBMEAC requires that all bedding be purchased on-site. No outside bedding allowed.**
- Please order bedding in advance on entry form.
- Facility stall will remove center partition for horse double stall (\$200 rate for weekend) if ordered by closing date. Limited number of stalls available. Please indicate on entry form.
- **State facility required all horses post extra coggins in sleeve on stall door.**

Arenas: All are 20 x 60 meters

- Competition: Two indoor with composite footing. Three outdoor with sand/stone dust combination.
- Warm-up: One covered with composite footing. One indoor with composite footing, three outdoor with sand/stone dust combination.

Hospitality: Food available on grounds during show hours.

Accommodations: Williamston Inn (252-799-0100). Inn at Moratoc (252-792-3184). Hampton Inn (252-809-1100)

Directions:

SBM Eastern Ag Center, 2900 NC Hwy 125 So., Williamston, NC 27892. Located just off NC 64 (just 48 miles east of I-95). From NC 64, take exit 512. Turn south, SBM Ag Center is 100 yards on right. TRAILERS, drive past mail entrance, take next right on Allen Williams Road (less than ¼ mil) for easier, direct stabling access.

Insurance: Under N.C. law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to or death of a participant, resulting in the inherent risk of equine activity (NC statute 99E; SC Art. 7, Ch. 9-47). All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events.

DOGS MUST BE ON LEASHES AT ALL TIMES WHILE ON SHOW GROUNDS OR IN STABLE AREAS. NO DOGS ALLOWED IN THE COLISEUM.

- Each barn has one sharps container per 50 horses available. Competition Management may fine any individual including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
- Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses

used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes. 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

- **ATTENTION COMPETITORS:** Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, United States Equestrian Federation) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.
